We think terms like 'refugee', 'migrant', 'asylum-seeker' or 'expat' do not reflect the real essence and identity of people who leave their homes behind to start a new life. Accordingly, instead of all these terms, we consider everyone who comes to our city an Izmirite.

In this spirit, I hope you will feel very much a part of this city and make valuable contributions to the multi-vocal and multi-coloured identity of Izmir and the culture of peaceful coexistence with your presence, culture and ideas.

We used this very approach to draft this City Guide for you and included all things related to Izmir, from life in Izmir to services provided by the Metropolitan Municipality to education, health, work permit and legal aid rights to organizations that provide support and assistance.

As the Mayor of this city, I would like you to know that I am committed to doing everything in my power to help you quickly adapt to your new life in Izmir and benefit from all available services.

PART 1 LIFE IN IZMIR

- Izmir



Izmir, Turkey's gateway to the west, is one of the most beautiful cities of the Mediterranean Basin with its climate, unique nature, and 8500 years of deeprooted history. The rich past and multi-cultural texture of Izmir as a port city makes it possible to observe intermingling of trade, arts, and culture for centuries, and to witness a blended culture relying on harmonization of east and west since it has been located at the intersection point of great civilizations throughout the history.



- Some Historical Places and Green **Areas of Izmir**



Tepekule Mound (Bayraklı)

Here, there are findings dating back to 3000 BC, and this is proof of Izmir's longstanding history.



Kadifekale

In the literature, it is stated that Macedonian Alexandros, who is called Alexander the Great in Turkish, defeated the Persian Empire army in 334 BC, came to Izmir region, and established a new city of Smyrna in the region currently denominated as Kadifekale.



Agora, located in the Basmane district in the city center, dates back to the 2nd century AD and belongs to the Roman Period.



Kızlarağası Inn

Built in 1744, this inn is not only the most glorious one in Izmir, but it also offers a good representation of Ottoman architecture. Today it is well-known with its coffee houses.




Konak Square and Clock Tower

It is a square that was constructed upon opening of the Government House in the 19th century during the Ottoman period. Konak Clock Tower, one of the symbols of Izmir, was built in 1901 due to the 25th anniversary of Sultan Abdulhamid II's ascension to the throne.



Elevator

Located in Karataş, Nesim Levi who was a Jewish businessperson living in Izmir, had this structure built in 1907 so as to provide people with a mechanism to climb up Halil Rıfat Paşa Street from Mithatpaşa Street.

WizmirNET

Izmir Metropolitan Municipality provides wireless internet access service in many of the communal areas of the city. Some of these areas are as follows: Gundogdu Square, Kulturpark (Fair) Konak Square, Passport, Asik Veysel Recreation Area, Historical Havagazi Factory, Halkapinar Metro Station, Buca Hasanaga Sports Complex, Inciralti Center for the Disabled, Camdibi Ataturk Park, and some ESHOT buses.



It is very easy to get connected to WizmirNET:

After opening the Wi-Fi list from a mobile phone, tablet, or computer, the "WizmirNET" network can be selected. Then, after a web page is opened from the browser, by clicking the "Register" button on the Home page, the requested information (phone number, etc.) is filled in, and lastly, the password sent to the phone is written in the relevant field and the internet usage is started.





In order to use public transportation vehicles such as buses, ferries, tram, metro, and IZBAN in Izmir, it is necessary to have IZMIRIMKART, which has enough money to cover transportation costs. Money can be loaded to IZMIRIMKART by using the machines located at metro stations, ferry ports, and IZBAN stations and from some kiosks and by credit card at izmirimkart.com.tr.



Students can either click the First Card Application tab on izmirimkart.com.tr to apply for a Student card or apply in person to one of the following centers:

- Konak Directorate of Electronic Cards
- Fahrettin Altay Card Application Center (Fahrettin Altay Transfer Center)
- BostanliCard Application Center (Bostanli Transfer Station)
- Konak Parking Garage Card Application Center (Under the Konak Parking Garage)



As of September 1, 2020, during transportation, usage made within 120 minutes after the third transfer is free of charge.



Until the COVID-19 measures are over, it is necessary to wear a mask in public transport. In addition, IZMIRIMKART must be matched with a personal HES Code valid for at least 6 months (for broader information on HES Code please see Part 3).







Bicycles can be rented by credit card and IZMIRIMKART at **Smart Bicycle Rental System (BISIM)** points. You can visit www.bisim.com.tr for up-to-date information about BISIM.

With a new decision taken by the Izmir Metropolitan Municipality in order to support the use of bicycles, passengers who get on the ferries and ferryboats by bicycle pay a discounted price.

Subscription Procedures in the City



Electricity

Electricity distribution in Izmir is carried out by Gediz Elektrik A.S. Subscription procedures regarding residential electricity, such as new subscription, subscriber transfer, security deposit return, and up-to-date security deposit inquiry can be carried out by going to Gediz Elektrik Customer Relations Centers (MIM) or by calling 0850 800 0 186. In addition, individual subscription applications, individual subscription termination applications, debt information inquiries, and payment information inquiries can be conducted through the e-government system. Before going to Gediz Elektrik MIM, an appointment can be set via randevu.gediz.com . HES Code is required when entering the centers.

Documents to be submitted for residential electricity subscription are:

- 1. The number of the installation to be subscribed,
- 2. Signed Retail Sales Agreement Application Form,
- 3. Original Identity Card,
- **4.** Policy or policy number to be obtained from the Natural Disaster Insurance Institution (DASK)
- **5.** When the consumer applies for a retail sales contract with a request for transfer to a place of use whose current retail sales contract has not been terminated, the company may request from the consumer the documents indicating the right to use the relevant residence. (Rental contract, housing allocation certificate for official institutions, title deed, water bill, natural gas bill, internet bill)



Water

Water subscriptions are made by IZSU in Izmir. In case of renting a new house or changing the name of the subscriber registered to the house, the steps to be followed, the necessary documents, and the fees to be paid are as follows:

Process Steps:

- 1. An application is made to the relevant Branch Office of the Department of Subscription Affairs.
- 2. The printed petition received from the system is signed.
- 3. The security deposit and old contract debts, if any, are paid.
- 4. The new contract is signed and thus the name on the contract can be modified.

Required Documents and Information

- 1. Petition (prepared by İZSU at the time of application)
- 2. A Document with Turkish Identity Number (Passport, Identity Card or Driver's License)

 If the subscriber cannot apply in person, a document regarding representation (letter of attorney)
- 3. DASK (Natural Disaster Insurance Policy) Policy Number



Natural Gas

Subscription procedures can be completed by applying to IZMIR DOGALGAZ Subscription Center. A customer contract is made for tenants. The documents required for this contract and the points to be considered are as follows:

- 1. Photocopy of Rental Contract, Certificate of Residence or Electricity / Water bill (must be in the name of the contractor)
- 2. Photocopy of the identity card of the contractor
- 3. Subscriber Account number

If the Subscriber Connection and Customer Agreement procedures are to be made by another person/company on behalf of the right owner, a letter of attorney and a copy of the proxy's identity card must be submitted.

Automatic payment instructions given to the bank after the subscriber connection procedure should be updated again after the customer agreement procedure.

Points to Consider When Renting a House

- It is necessary to have a valid ID to rent a house in Turkey.
- To rent a house, a Rental Agreement (contract) must be concluded between the landlord and the person who wants to rent the house. This contract can be oral or written, but a written rental contract should be preferred as an assurance.
- It is important to ensure that the information about the person who rented the house and the address of the rented house are written correctly in the contract. It is required to act diligently to indicate the rental price, the starting date of the rental period, the duration of the contract, the payment method (bank transfer, etc.), the current status of the rented house, and the deposit amount in the contract. Each page of the contract must be signed by both parties. One copy of the contract must be held by landlord whereas another copy shall be kept by the renter.

- After the rental contract is signed, the electricity, water and natural gas subscriptions of the house must be completed by the renter in his/her name.
- The landlord must pay the cost of repairs to fix the defects in the home fixtures.
- Rental contracts are usually signed for one year unless otherwise is specified.
 Term of the contract shall be properly specified. The increase rate of the rent
 can be determined in the rental contract. However, even if the increase rate of
 the rent is determined in the contract, this rate cannot exceed the change rate
 calculated on the basis of alterations in 12-month averages of the consumer
 price index (CPI) in the previous rental year pursuant to Article 344 of the Turkish
 Code of Obligations.
- Rent increases are affected at the end of the period specified in the contract.
 Rent increases cannot be made within the rental period.
- If the landlord wants to dispossess the tenant before the end of the contract period, there must be a fair reason.
- The tenant can leave the house by notifying the landlord 15 days before the contract expires. If the renter leaves the house before the contract expires, the renter is still obliged to pay the rent for the remaining months.
- If no notification on termination is made for rental contracts that are issued
 with a definite time period 15 days prior to the expiry date of the contract, the
 contract shall be extended for another year under the same conditions. Landlord
 cannot terminate the contract based on expiration in these circumstances

Disaster and Emergency Gathering Areas in Izmir

Disaster and emergency gathering areas are safe areas where people can gather away from dangerous areas immediately after disasters and emergencies (earthquakes, fire, flood, etc.) in order to prevent panic and ensure healthy information exchange in the meantime until temporary accommodation centers are made available.

Women Shelter

The Women Shelter aims to temporarily meet the basic needs, primarily housing, of women, girls up to the age of 18 and boys up to the age of 12 who have experienced violence and discrimination or are at risk of violence, and to empower these women and children in this process. Application to the shelter can be made through the nearest police station, gendarmerie, or the Violence Monitoring and Prevention Center (SONIM=Siddet Izleme ve Onleme Merkezi).

Services for Children and Youth



Children and Youth Centers (ÇOGEMs / Cocuk ve Genclik Merkezleri)

These are the centers that have been established to contribute to the development of children aged 7-14 in a safe environment. These centers carry out activities for children to make use of their out-of-school time effectively and develop their skills. Education support services are provided for children. Art education studies and cultural trips are organized. Social service counseling services are provided in order to ensure the continuity of the physiological and psycho-social development of children through psychological counseling services for individuals, families, and groups. Cooperation activities and trainings are carried out with schools and families in order to ensure the continuity of the children in education and to reintegrate them into education.

Fairytale Houses:

Fairytale Houses are the centers where the needs and developmental characteristics of children aged between 36 and 53 months are considered, and within this context, activities such as socio-cultural activities, meeting with nature workshops, awareness and concept studies on children's rights, body coordination, painting, handicraft, and language development activities and music workshops are carried out. For mothers, vocational and skill courses are organized, and awareness group activities are conducted.

Emergency Services



Fire and Emergency Response Branch Office affiliated to the Department of Fire Brigade handles home, vehicle, workplace, and closed area fires (tunnel, etc.), flood, suicide cases, multistorey building, skyscraper fires, and in cases of fire risk, companionship service is provided for precautionary purposes.

By Fire Department Directorate of Search & Rescue and Disaster Affairs, urban search and rescue (earthquake, dent), mountain and nature search and rescue, underwater and surface search and rescue activities are carried out. In addition to those, traffic accidents, falling into a well, being stuck in an elevator, landslide and CBRN (chemical, biological, radiological, nuclear) incidents are intervened, and precautionary escort services are provided with sea boat and AKS (Search & Rescue and Health=Arama Kurtarma ve Saglik) vehicles.

These services are accessible as free of charge through the 112 and 110 **Emergency Call Centers.**

- Funeral Services



When a person dies, a death report is given from the hospital, if the person died at home, death report can be obtained through any family health center or the doctor of the district municipality. By calling the Izmir Metropolitan Municipality Funeral Services number 188 (ALO 188), information about the death is given. A vehicle for the funeral is allocated by the Funeral Services.

All services related to the burial procedures of the relatives of the citizens who verbally declare that their financial situation is not well during the procedures are provided free of charge by the Izmir Metropolitan Municipality.

Disinfection and Pest Control Services



The Pest Control Unit of the Environmental Protection and Control Directorate of Izmir Metropolitan Municipality conducts all activities to combat mosquitoes throughout the year. In addition, periodic disinfection is carried out according to a specific program to combat pests such as cockroaches, lice, fleas, ticks, houseflies, and mice. Garbage containers placed on streets and main roads are regularly disinfected against the growth of pests. In order to combat microorganisms such as bacteria, viruses, and fungi that cause danger to human health, disinfection is carried out in public areas.

PART 3

REFUGEES' RIGHTS, OBLIGATIONS, AND RELEVANT INSTITUTIONS

Registration



Izmir Provincial Directorate of Migration Management

- Refugees living in Izmir are required to register at Izmir Provincial Directorate of Migration Management and obtain a Temporary Protection (TP) or International Protection (IP) identity document.
- The prerequisite for the enjoyment of rights and services in Turkey is to be registered.
- Persons registered in Izmir under temporary protection or international
 protection are under obligation to report address change, change in civil status,
 such as marriage, birth, death, and change in their work situation (e.g. obtaining
 work permit), contact information change to the Data Verification Center
 in Alsancak within 20 days. Also, people with specific needs, can inform the
 Provincial Directorate about their situation via Data Verification Center.
- Before going to Izmir Provincial Directorate of Migration
 Management and Data Verification Center, it is necessary to
 make an appointment at https://e-randevu.goc.gov.tr/
- Children born in Turkey must be registered immediately to the Provincial Directorate of Migration Management.
 Alongside the Provincial Directorate, you need to notify the birth of your child to the Civil Registry Office in the district where you reside.
- International protection applicants and status holders have reporting duties as per the legislation.
 They need to report in terms determined by the Provincial Directorate of Migration Management.



- Refugees are obliged to reside in the province specified on their identity documents. They cannot access to rights and services outside their province of residence.
- In order to travel or move to another province refugees need to obtain a travel permit document from the Provincial Directorate of Migration Management. If they leave their province of residence without a travel permit obtained from the Provincial Directorate of Migration Management, there might be some legal sanctions. Traveling without a Travel Permit may lead to administrative action for temporary protection holders and for people under international protection it may result in their application for international protection to be considered withdrawn.
- In order to change their city of registration, refugees need to apply to the Provincial Directorate of Migration Management for transfer to another city. They can legally change their city of registration with the travel permit document issued upon approval of their request.

How to Apply for a Travel Permit via E-Government?

Currently, the application for the Travel Permit Document is reachable on e-government. Upon completion of the questions regarding the relevant travel permit on the system, the request for travel permit is recorded for assessment.

Foreigners Communication Center (YİMER) 157

This line, owned by the Directorate General of Migration Management, can be called 24/7 for questions concerning international protection and temporary protection procedures and access to rights and services. Also, line assists victims of human trafficking and refers distress calls at sea to the Turkish Coast Guards for rescue. The line serves in seven languages: Turkish, English, Arabic, Persian, Russian, German, and Pashto.

Marriage Procedures

Marriage procedures are conducted in line with the Turkish Civil Code also for refugees. According to the Turkish Civil Code, the earliest age of marriage is 18. However, children who are 17 years old can marry with the permission of their parents (with a letter of consent), and children aged 16 can only marry in exceptional circumstances and if there is crucial reason with a court decision.

Based on above legislation, persons below 18 years old cannot marry and any marriage with a religious ceremony would not be valid and subject to criminal proceedings under Turkish criminal law. Accordingly, sexual abuse of the child is punishable with imprisonment.

Also, marriage with more than one spouse is not legal under the Turkish Civil Code and a criminal offense under the Turkish Penal Code.

Marriage procedure conducted only by authorized officials is considered official. Therefore, marriage through religious ceremony is not valid in Turkey.

- Refugees must obtain a celibacy document to marry either from the Provincial Directorate of Migration Management or on e-government in order to marry officially.
- Official marriage is realized by applying to the Marriage Departments of Municipalities.

- In places where there is neither Violence Prevention and Monitoring Centers (ŞÖNİM) nor the first admission unit, these centers undertake their duties.
- Persons at risk such as unaccompanied refugee children, children exposed to violence and abuse, and women exposed to gender-based violence can be referred to these centers.
- Social and Economic Support (SED) applications are also accepted by these centers for the children of families who cannot meet the basic needs of their children and who have difficulty in living even at a minimum level.

ALO 183: It is the Social Support Line number of the Ministry of Family and Social Services. This line is accessible for support and reporting in cases of violence against women, violence against children, and abuse. In addition, it can also is reachable for guidance and counseling for family, women, children, disabled and elderly people. Kurdish and Arabic language options are available. This line is available 24/7.

Mechanisms for Combating Violence Against Women

Law No. 6284 on the Protection of Family and Prevention of Violence Against Women has introduced a series of mechanisms aimed at protecting every woman in Turkey from violence. Pursuant to Law No. 6284, a preventive and protective order can be issued against the perpetrator of violence. Women who have been subjected to/at risk of violence should state that they want to benefit from Law No. 6284 when they go to the police or prosecutor's office.

In KADES application, there are Turkish, Arabic, Persian, English, Russian and French language options.



Violence Prevention and Monitoring Centers (ŞÖNİM)

- Violence Prevention and Monitoring Centers (\$ÖNİM) were established within the scope of Law No. 6284.
- ŞÖNİM is a center that provides shelter measures for all women, including
 refugee women, children, and family members who have been subjected to, or
 are at risk of, violence, and for the persons who have been exposed to stalking.
 ŞÖNİM gives legal, psycho-social, economic support and, where necessary,
 health support. It also supports women who have been subjected to violence to
 stay in a shelter or another address and provides them with support during their
 stay.
- According to the Circular of the Governorate of Izmir published in September 2020, during the procedures in \$ÖNİM; law enforcement units, judicial authorities, and health units, Izmir Provincial Directorate of Migration Management is responsible to provide an interpreter on a 24/7 basis.

- Education

Registered school-aged refugee children are entitled to 12 years of compulsory education for free. In order for refugee children to be enrolled in schools affiliated to the Ministry of National Education in Izmir, they must be registered with the Provincial Directorate of Migration Management. Children can be registered at school by applying to the primary school closest to the child's residential address or to the District Directorate of National Education. Refugees and asylum seekers who have completed their high school education can receive university education if they are successful in The Foreign Student Examination (FSE). Refugees can receive services from Public Education Centers and can also receive education by enrolling in Open Education Schools.





Izmir Provincial Directorate of National Education

- The units carrying out services such as primary and secondary education, vocational and technical education, special education and guidance and lifelong learning in Izmir are affiliated with the Provincial Directorate of National Education.
- For refugee children who have been educated in another country but who do
 not have documents proving their education, the Provincial National Education
 Commissions under the Provincial Directorate of National Education decides
 which class the child will be placed in. For refugee children who have documents
 proving their education in another country, these documents must be submitted
 to the authorized institutions during the registration process.

Public Education Centers

- These are centers affiliated to the Provincial Directorate of National Education that organize courses in a wide variety of fields within the scope of lifelong learning activities.
- Refugees can attend the Turkish language courses for adults.
- Open Education School enrollment and necessary procedures are carried out.
 Refugees can also be registered in Open Education Schools.
- The Accelerated Education Program (HEP=Hizlandirilmis Egitim Programi) aims to ensure that refugee children under the age of 18 who have not enrolled in school for at least 3 years, complete the education level they lack, by participating in formal education programs. HEP is applied in Public Education Centers in seven districts, including Karabaglar, Bornova and Foca.

Guidance and Research Centers (GRC-RAM)

- These centers concern with enabling children and young people with disabilities
 to enjoy their right to education. Applications of persons with disabilities for
 education are evaluated by special education boards within GRCs. These boards
 carry out educational evaluation and diagnostic processes. As a result of the
 board evaluation made after the application, the Special Education Evaluation
 Board Report is prepared, and the person is directed to the appropriate special
 education service.
- For Syrians and refugees from other nationalities, there is no option to be directed to Private Education Institutions. These students can only participate in public special education schools or inclusive classes, affiliated with the state.

- Health



Refugees registered in Izmir can benefit from the health services provided in Migrant Health Centers (MHC), state hospitals, and family health centers in the city. In order for refugees registered in other provinces to be treated in hospitals in Izmir, they must be referred from a hospital in the province they are registered in. People who are not registered (unregistered) in the Provincial Directorate of Migration Management can only benefit from emergency health services.



- People under temporary protection can go directly to public hospitals. However, they can receive service in private hospitals and university hospitals only if they are referred from a public health institution.
- The costs of healthcare services, including secondary and tertiary services received by individuals under temporary protection, are covered by the Directorate General of Migration Management (DGMM) in accordance with the amounts specified in the SUT (Health Implementation Communiqué=Saglik Uygulama Tebligi).
- According to the protocol signed by the Ministry of Health and DGMM in 2020;
 Article 7 (2): Treatment costs will not be reimbursed for the loss of the organ and
 limb before entering Turkey; Article 9 (2): Costs related to assisted reproductive
 IVF (in vitro fertilization) treatments are not reimbursed; and Article 8 (6):
 Although medical supplies and medicines used during the treatment of patients
 treated in bed are included in the costs to be covered by DGMM, medicines that
 must be procured from abroad are not reimbursed.

- Health insurance of persons under International Protection will be active within
 the first year of their registration for those who does not have any other health
 coverage or means to cover their health expenses. This one-year limit is not
 sought for those whose general health insurance continuation is deemed
 appropriate by the Ministry. Persons with specific medical needs can approach
 to the Provincial Directorate of Migration Management with their medical reports
 and request activation of their insurance.
- Central Physician Appointment System (Merkezi Hekim Randevu Sistemi-MHRS)
 (ALO 182) is a system through which international protection applicants/ status
 holders and Syrians under temporary protection can make an appointment at a
 hospital and doctor of their choice.
- The application can be made for patients in need of home care by calling 444 38
 33 Home Care Services Contact Center of the Ministry of Health in Izmir.



Migrant Health Centers (MHC)

Migrant health center (MHC) is the center that has been established to provide access to health services for Syrians under Temporary Protection, and later it has begun to serve other refugees.

- In these centers, primary healthcare services are provided similar to family health centers (FHCs).
- In addition to primary health care services, internal medicine, pediatrics, gynecology, orthodontics, and psychosocial support services are provided in reinforced GSM units, and there are also imaging units and simple service laboratories.

- Application for Work Permit



How to Apply for a Work Permit?

- Work permit is not automatically gained through temporary protection or international protection applicant or status holder ID card. Beneficiaries of temporary protection and international protection applicants and status holder can apply for work permit six months after receiving their ID cards. Applications made by the employer via e-Government portal (www.turkiye.gov.tr or https://ecalismaizni.ailevecalisma.gov.tr/eizin) by following the steps on the portal Applicant is required to have a registration of e-Government as employer, submitting requested documents (The contract signed between the employer and the employee, a photograph of the individual, etc.) and complete the application.
- If the employee will work as an education or healthcare professional, a
 preliminary permit from Ministry of National Education or Ministry of Health must
 be obtained.

- The number of Syrians under temporary protection who will work in a workplace cannot be more than 10% of the total number of people working there, and if there are less than ten people working in the workplace, only one Syrian can be employed. The number of fees to be paid for the work permit is determined each year. A work quota also applies to international protection applicants and status holders, but in a workplace where applicants for international protection work, there should be at least five working citizens of Turkey.
- Individuals who will work independently (who will establish their own businesses) should also apply through the "Foreigners Working on Their Own Name and Account" tab, six months after receiving their temporary protection or international protection ID card.
- For international protection applicants and status holders, temporary protection beneficiaries who will work as seasonal agricultural and livestock workers, a work permit exemption certificate must be obtained from the Provincial Directorate of Labor and Employment Agency of the province where these people reside.

ALO 170: It is an information service line that workers and employers can reach for any questions, suggestions, and complaints.

Turkish Employment Agency (İŞKUR)

- Provincial Directorates of Labor and Employment Agency are the institution that facilitates to find jobs and workers.
- İŞKUR, together with international organizations for Syrians under temporary protection, carries out projects to increase registered employment, supported by European Union funds. Within the scope of these projects, vocational training and skill courses are provided some of which are guaranteeing employment.
- Applications for exemption from work permit for seasonal agricultural work
 of persons under temporary protection and people who are international
 protection applicants or status holders are made to the Provincial Directorates
 of Labor and Employment Agency.

Application for Legal Aid, E-Government and HES Code



How to Apply for Legal Aid?

Legal aid is an aid available to those who cannot afford lawyers and trial expenses. If a person is a victim, a complainant (in situations such as being exposed to violence against women), a suspect or an accused of a crime, this person may request an appointment with a lawyer free of charge from the Bar Association at police or gendarmerie stations, at public prosecutor's offices and criminal courts through these authorities.

For legal and administrative cases (such as divorce, appeal to deportation orders and appeal to rejections on international protection issued by PDMMs), legal aid can be requested by applying to the Legal Aid Office of Izmir Bar Association together with the residence document, poverty certificate which is issued by mukhtars, photocopy of identity card, SGK record that is accessible on e-government web site, inquiry documents about whether the person has a vehicle (Polnet) or real estate (deed). Exemptions from litigation fees and trial expenses can be requested by applying for legal aid with the same documents in the courts.

The legal aid service provided by the Izmir Bar Association is a service on the initiative of the Bar Association. This service is not provided directly to everyone who applies, but only if the application is evaluated positively.

What is E-Government Password? How to get it?

Many transactions are reachable from e-government system now. In order to use the e-government, at first, the nearest PTT branch should be visited then the e-government password should be got in an envelope to the person. Then, reaching the address https://www.turkiye.gov.tr/, "Log" tab is clicked and related fields are filled with TR Identification Number/Foreigner Identity Number and obtained password from PTT. In the end, you can use e-government system.




What is HES Code? How to get it?

Hayat Eve Siğar (HES) Code is the code that is mandatory in transportation and entering many public institutions, indicating whether the person has any risk in terms of Covid-19 disease.

HES Code can be obtained in 3 ways:

- 1. By clicking on the "HES Code Generation and Listing" tab from the e-government
- 2. By sending an SMS to 2023; After typing HES, Foreigners ID Number (starts with 99), birth year and code sharing time (in number



3. By downloading the HES Application to the smartphone.

In addition, foreigners who do not have a mobile number which belongs to local GSM operators can get a HES Code with their Passport information by sending an SMS to the number +90555 944 3821 by typing respectively HES, Nationality, Passport Serial Number, Birth Year and Surname, with a space between each of them.


